He was a very talented singer who was active in both Chorus and Urbane. David was also a very hard working student who was on his way home from his part-time job at Kalahari when this accident occurred. We pray for David and the members of his family as they deal with this very tragic loss.

We had crisis counselors available in our West High School yesterday and will make them available for as long as needed to help our students, faculty and staff.

Senator for a Day: Thirty students from Pocono Mountain East High School participated in a Senator for a Day seminar sponsored by State Senator Mario Scavello. The seminar at Northampton Community College offered the students the opportunity to role-play as a State Senator in a mock legislative session.

West High School Community Service: Students from the West High Student Council's Community Service Committee visited The Mountain Center in Tobyhanna to bring "A Day of Literacy" to two Head Start classes. The high school students read the book "Giraffes Can't Dance" and had many fun activities planned for the pre-school children to go along with the book, including Pin the Tail on the Giraffe and making animal hats. Each Head Start student was provided with a copy of the book to take home with them to promote literacy in early learners.

Unique Canned Food Drive: The East High School National Honor Society held a door decorating contest for Halloween. Students could bring in canned food items to get points for their homeroom and to allow them to vote on a different door for best design. Mr. Kier's homeroom collected the most cans, and Ms. Jacobi's door won the prize for best door. Both homerooms received a bagel breakfast. More than 2,000 cans were collected and will be delivered to a local food pantry.
