Governor's Press Conference: Pocono Mountain School District had the honor of hosting a press conference for Governor Wolf last week where he announced his proposal to change the Charter School Law. We held the press conference in the Pocono Mountain West High School Library and Dr. Wade welcomed our guests. I was offered the opportunity to present comments during the press conference on the need for Charter School Law reform in accountability, transparency and funding, especially in how tuition rates are based upon the sending school district's budget, not the operating costs of the charter and cyber schools.

School Safety Update: Beth DeLay, the Director of Health/Physical Education, Guidance and Nursing Services, updated the school safety go bags over the summer, to ensure the bags are ready for teachers and staff at the start of the school year. The safety assessments are confidential but are used by our administrators to prioritize and improve school safety measures.

Open Houses & Orientations: Our school open houses and new student orientations are underway this week in all of our schools as we prepare for the first day of school.
