

The 1988 Pocono Mountain Cardinal Football Team had one of the greatest seasons in school history. Recording a perfect undefeated season of 12 wins, the team never trailed an opponent in the 11 game regular season. The team won the 1988 Centennial League and went on to defeat Easton High school in overtime 20-17 in the District XI 4A Championship game. Offensively the Cardinals scored 326 points in the season for an average of 27.16 points per game with a total of 46 touchdowns. Their quick paced attack amassed more than 3,505 yards of total offense for an average of 292 yards per game. The high powered offense produced 2 running backs that rushed for more than 1,000 yards each that season. Defensively the Cardinals posted an impressive 6 shutouts. Moreover, the stubborn Cardinal defense allowed a mere 3.92 points per game, 6 touchdowns and gave up only a total of 2,111 offensive yards. Following the season the team was honored with the District XI officials "Top Sportsmanship" team award. Numerous of players from that team were honored post-season with 1st and 2nd Team All-League and 1st and 2nd Team All-Area recognition. In addition 2 players were named to the All-state and Pennsylvania Big 33 team and 1 player with All-American honors.
