



The school was given the marker for its commitment to education and it was all done in honor of Judi Leiding's mother Edna Bonzer. Edna was a teacher at TEC for many years and served as a volunteer until the age of 88! There is a code on the roadside marker and if you scan it with a smartphone you can trace the history of various schools that were once located on the property.



WHY IS THE STATUE OF LIBERTY GREEN?


3RD GRADE

We collected pennies, vinegar, salt, and water. We watched a chemical process occur over several days as we dipped pennies into our mixture. We recorded what we saw. Oxidation took place! This is why the Statue of Liberty is green. She also stands up to lots of weathering! Ask the third graders about copper and green pennies! They can explain the process to you!

TEC's English Language Learner population is growing! This year we have added another ESL teacher to our faculty. Mrs. Murphy joins Ms. Yarashas in instructing our English learners whose families come from dozens of different countries and speak 12 languages! Between the two teachers, they bring 40 years of teaching experience to our building! In addition to Mrs. Murphy being new, we have a new ESL class pet! Cookie, the guinea pig, joined Kaytee, also a guinea pig, in Ms. Yarashas' classroom. Students now have TWO class pets! Cookie and Kaytee are teaching the students about being responsible and taking care of animals. They are loved by everyone!

ESL students started the year with LAS LINKS testing. LAS LINKS is an assessment that helps us see the students' progress in the areas of Listening, Reading, Speaking and Writing in English. Students take the test on computers a few times a year to show what they know. The students then took a break from their beginning of the year benchmark testing to work on a fun project with Ms. Yarashas and Mrs. Murphy. Language learners in grades K through 6 shared information about themselves including their families, friends, likes and dislikes. It's great getting to know each other!








Polish Heritage Month



October was Polish Heritage Month! Did you know that 9.5 MILLION Americans are of Polish descent? In fact, almost 670,000 Americans speak Polish in addition to English! In the Pocono Mountain School District, 113 students speak Polish! A few of them are right here in Tobyhanna Elementary Center. Chicago, IL, is home to the largest population of Polish Americans in the United States. New York, New Jersey and even Pennsylvania are known to have many families who share Polish heritage.

Areas with large Polish American communities often celebrate their culture with picnics and festivals. In Chicago, they celebrate with a festival called the "Taste of Polonia." It is held each year on Labor Day weekend. These gatherings often include polka bands and music with singers, drums, accordions and trumpets. People participate in traditional dances like the polka, oberek, "Polish Hop" and waltzes. They also celebrate with lots of food. Traditional foods of Poland include pierogi (often a potato and cheese filled pasta pocket), kielbasa (a Polish sausage), golabki (cabbage rolls filled with meat and rice), and babka cake (a sweet bread-like cake filled with layers of chocolate or cinnamon).
