1. Log on to “Yabla.com” using the user name and password you created in school. If you cannot remember this information, please email your teacher. Using your Yabla account, join “AP French”. At the bottom of the Yabla page, under “Get Yabla”, find “Sign up with access code”. Copy and post this link into your web browser <https://www.yabla.com/code/iugwr3ns> or open your yabla account and use this access code to join the class: I U G W R 3 N S
2. I looked for videos that correlate with content we will be reviewing and studying in 2020-2021. I hope that each of you attain these goals: listening practice, vocabulary acquisition and learning something new about France and French culture.
3. You must watch the eight “Yabla” videos I have assigned and complete the activities by the due dates listed. Similar to what we have done in the past:
  - a. Watch each video.
  - b. Complete the vocabulary practice two times.
  - c. Complete the multiple choice practice one time.
4. Each Yabla practice exercise will be graded based on **accuracy**. Each assignment is worth 12.5 points, and will be added together to be your first Test grade for the AP class. This grade will appear in your Home Access when the 2020-2021 school year begins.

Yabla due dates:

1. In addition to the Yabla assignments, you will give a mini-presentation the first day of school. Your presentation must have visuals and you should be prepared to speak in French for at least 30 seconds.
2. Your visuals should include pictures or photos of activities that you did during the summer, be sure to document your activities throughout the summer. Your visuals can be a collage or a Powerpoint slide show or a Google slide show. It should include several pictures/photos that correlate with your presentation. You can email your presentation to Madame Cassidy or bring it to school on a flash drive.
3. You should be prepared to narrate your collage/slide show en français. Of course, because you are talking about what you DID during the summer, you should use the past tenses (passé récent, passé composé, imparfait) as is appropriate. You should be able to speak for at least 30 seconds. You cannot read your presentation. You may use note cards with key words on them, but you cannot write out your entire presentation. You should also be prepared to answer any questions that the class may have en français.
4. The presentation will be worth 50 points and be evaluated based on:
  - a. Visuals (10 points)
  - b. Comprehensibility (10 points)
  - c. Vocabulary (10 points)
  - d. Accurate usage of past tenses (10 points)
  - e. Fluency (10 points)

IF Yabla connection is unavailable for some reason: Keep a journal of how you spent 30 minutes per week, listening to and reading French realia. This could be movies, music, youtube, books, magazines or newspapers that are completely in French. Every week there needs to be a dated entry, the name of the platform used, and at least 10 sentences written in French, in reaction to what you heard/read. This may be a summarization, opinion, or an idea that it sparked.

AND prepare yourself to present to the class, how this practice expanded your French skills.
