First Class Athletic Hall of Fame

Jenifer Nish-Del Grosso

Jennifer earned four varsity letters in the sports of girls': field hockey, basketball, softball and soccer. As a basketball player at Pocono Mountain, Mrs. DelGrosso led her team to three consecutive league championships. She is the all-time career scoring leader for girls with 1790 points, was a four-time All-Pocono selection and a three-time all- league selection. After high school Jen attended the University of Scranton, where she holds many of that school's women's basketball records, including career points. She was a three-time Kodak All-American and a three-time Academic All-American

Gary Kirkwood

Gary was a four-year letterman in basketball and a 1,000 point scorer. He also was a three-year letterman in football and baseball. He was first team all-league in basketball and a member of the 1967 league championship team in baseball, Pocono Mountain's first league championship in any sport.

Jennifer Krolikowski

Jennifer was a four-year letter winner in girls' basketball and a 1,000 point scorer. Upon graduation she attended New York University, where she was a member of their NCAA National Championship women's basketball team. While at NYU, Jen was a three-time all-conference player, three-time ECAC Scholar Athlete of the Year, and three-time NIT All-Metropolitan first team member. She is NYU's all-time leading scorer and was named to the Kodak All-American Team.

Kendrick Morgan

Kendrick was a three-time letter winner in both track and basketball. In basketball he was a two-time all-league selection. In track he was the only state champion in Pocono Mountain history. His jump of 50 feet, $1\frac{1}{2}$ inches set a then-state record in the triple jump. Kendrick still holds the District 11 record of 47 feet, 7 inches. Kendrick received a track and field scholarship to the University of North Carolina, where he was an eight-time All-American (indoor and outdoor) in the triple jump. In both 1996 and 2000 he was invited to attend the United States Olympic trials.

Susan Rowe

Susan earned letters in both field hockey and basketball. In basketball she became the girls' first 1,000 point scorer and was named to the league all-star team. In field hockey she led the league in scoring in both her junior and senior seasons. Upon graduation Susan attended Ursinus College where she participated in field hockey, badminton, and softball.

Mike Terhune

Mike was a four-year letterman in baseball and a three-year letterman in basketball. As a member of the baseball team, he played on three league champion teams. He was named to the all-league team three years and was the team MVP as a senior. Mike attended Virginia Tech University on a baseball scholarship and was named to the all-league team as a sophomore. Mike was drafted by the Atlanta Braves and reached the AA level before being traded to the NY Mets organization. Mike retired from professional baseball in 2002.

Edward Watto

Ed is a graduate of Nesquehoning High School and Stevens Technical School. While attending these schools, he participated in football, wrestling and basketball. Ed is also a graduate of East Stroudsburg University. His professional career started at Towanda High School, where he served as their football coach. In 1963 he started his career at Pocono Mountain High School as a health and physical education teacher and the defensive coordinator for football. In the winter he established the wrestling program at Pocono Mountain and coached the team until 1991. During his tenure, Ed's wrestling teams' amassed 278 dual meet victories and 12 tournament championships. In 1996 he was inducted into the District 11 Wrestling Hall of Fame, and in 1997 he was inducted into the Carbon County Sports Hall of Fame. Ed served as Pocono Mountain's athletic director from 1971 until his retirement in December 2005.
