<u>Michael Catalano, Class of 1988:</u> Michael was a three year starter and varsity letter winner in both football and basketball at Pocono Mountain. He also was the captain of both teams. In football, he was a two way starter and was named to the all-league and all-area team as both quarterback and defensive back. Michael was Pocono Mountain's selection for the National Football Foundation's Scholar Athlete award. In basketball, he was also a member of the all-league and all-area teams as a guard. He was selected as a member of the LARC All-Star basketball team. Michael was also the Class of 1988 valedictorian, as well as class president. After Pocono Mountain, Michael went on to play basketball at Albany College of Pharmacy.

<u>Wade Sweeney, Class of 1990</u>: Wade was a letterman in both track and cross country. He was the league champion in both the mile and two mile in track. Wade was the 1989 League champion and District 11 champion in cross country. He finished 15th in the PIAA state cross country meet. Wade went on to compete in cross country at East Stroudsburg University.

<u>Moira Ritchie Clark, Class of 1996</u>: Moira was a rare athlete at Pocono Mountain; she graduated with 12 varsity letters: four in field hockey, four in soccer, and four in swimming. In field hockey, she was a two time all league selection and captain her senior year. In soccer, she was a member of the team which was a two time District 11 runner up. In swimming, she qualified for the District 11 championship four times and was named captain her senior year. After graduation, Moira attended Lock Haven University where she played field hockey and lacrosse. At Lock Haven, Moira earned eight varsity letters and was captain of both squads as a senior.

<u>Kenneth Crowe, Class of 2002</u>: Kenneth was a three year letterman in soccer. He was named to the allleague team as a junior and senior. His senior year, Kenneth set a school record for goals in a season with 29. He also holds the school record for career goals with 53. After graduation from Pocono Mountain, Kenneth attended Catawba College. While attending Catawba, he was a four year starter and four year all-conference selection. Kenneth was named captain and first team All-American his senior year.

<u>Adam Gonzalez, Class of 2002:</u> Adam was a three year letterman in basketball. He was a 1,000 point scorer at Pocono Mountain and the leading scorer in school history. As a senior, Adam was the leading scorer in Monroe County and named to the second team all-state team. He was the MVC player of the year, as well as Channel 13 player of the year. After graduating from Pocono Mountain, Adam attended Quinnipiac University where he played basketball. At Quinnipiac, Adam was the NJCAA National Player of the Year. He was a 1,000 point scorer and named first team All-American. After graduating, Adam spent two seasons playing professional basketball in Puerto Rico.
