Grace (Coyle) Souter, Class of 2001

Grace was a 3 time Mountain Valley Conference diving champion, a two time District 11 diving champion, and finished 5th in the state her junior year and 3rd in the state her senior year. Grace holds all of the Pocono Mountain school records for diving as well as several Mountain Valley Conference records. After graduation, Grace attended Columbia University in New York City. She was a varsity letter winner all four years at Columbia, serving as captain her senior year. She capped her senior season finishing 2nd on the 3-meter board, earning both Second-Team All-Ivy and Academic All-Ivy honors. Grace currently is the Director of Operations at Koru Village in North Carolina, where she resides with her husband Justin and son Cash.

Jon Laudenslager, Class of 1994

Jon was a four- time Centennial League champion in wrestling. He was a District 11 champion and Northeast Regional runner up. He finished 3rd in the PIAA wrestling championships and still holds the school record for victories with 117. He attended Wilkes University, where he was a four year starter and was named E. I. W. A. Freshman of the year. Jon is currently the head wrestling coach at Wilkes University in Wilkes Barre, where he resides with his wife Tasha and children Kyle, Alissa, and Chase.

Curt Chastain, Class of 1987

Curt was a three-sport letter winner at Pocono Mountain. In football, he was both All League and All Area and was named Most Valuable Player as a senior. In wrestling, he was a two time Centennial League champion, as well as a regional runner up his senior season. In track, he was the league champion his senior year in the discus. He attended the University of Delaware, where he was a two-time varsity letter winner. As a senior he was named to the First Team as a center for both the Yankee Conference and All- East teams. He was an honorable mention All American. While at Delaware he also participated in wrestling. Curt currently is a homebuilder in south eastern Pennsylvania where he resides with his wife Kathy and his children Nick and James.

Jim Pinciotti, Class of 1982

Jim was a three-sport letter winner at Pocono Mountain. In football, he was a three-year letter winner. He was a team captain his senior season. He was named both All-league and All-Area at running back his senior year. In basketball he was a two year letter winner. In track and field he was a four-year letter winner. He was the league champion in four events and a District 11 champion in one. He also competed in the state track meet in four different events. He was captain of the league championship track team his senior season. After graduation he attended East Stroudsburg University where he was a varsity letter winner in track and field .

Al Shollenberger, Coach

Al was a letter man in Soccer, Basketball and Baseball at Hamburg High School. He was All League in both Soccer and Basketball. After graduation he attended East Stroudsburg University, where he was a member of the Soccer and Swim Team. In his junior year the soccer team was undefeated. Upon graduation, Al taught physical education and coached football, wrestling and track at Susquehanna Township. In 1958 Al moved to Pocono Mountain and was the Head Basketball and Baseball coach as well as the Athletic Director at Barrett. When Pocono Mountain joined the area schools in 1961 Al became the Varsity football coach posting the school's first win 12-0 over Puis X. From 1963-1972 Al served as the Boys Basketball coach. Under his direction the team won several league championships. Al also served as the Girls Varsity coach from 1982-1986. In 1990 Al retired from teaching and from 1990-1995 he was an adjunct professor at East Stroudsburg University.
