Nutrition Corner: CROSS CONTACT

Every day, students with allergies trust us to serve them **safe meals**, something we can only do by preventing cross contact. 1 in 13 children have a food allergy, and that statistic is growing!

What is cross contact?

The mixing of proteins (allergens) from one food to another

What does cross contact look like?

- Making a regular & GF sandwich on one cutting board
- Not washing your hands between tasks

Tips to Prevent Cross Contact:

- Prepare the allergen-free food first
- Wash & sanitize equipment
- If you make a mistake, start over with all new ingredients

<u>Remember:</u> Cooking food that has been in contact with a protein (allergen) does **not** kill the protein.





PA Harvest of the Month Coloring Contest

Each month, from September 2023 to February 2024, K-3 students at 3 of our district schools will have the opportunity to enter a coloring contest for the chance to win a prize!



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Christian Levins' coloring page won Swiftwater Elementary Center's September 2023 coloring contest.




Ayala Floyd's coloring page won Clear Run Elementary Center's September 2023 coloring contest.
