## Superintendent's Student & Staff Accomplishments June 7, 2023

**East Cardinal Softball Team:** Congratulations to the Pocono Mountain East Cardinal Girls Softball team on earning the District XI 5A Championship title by defeating Whitehall 7 to 6. This is the East Softball team's second District XI 5A Championship title.

East Cardinal Baseball Team: Congratulations to the Pocono Mountain East Cardinal Baseball team on earning the District XI 5A Championship title by defeating Pleasant Valley 4 to 3. The East Baseball team defeated Upper Dublin 4-2 to advance to the Quarterfinal Round of the State Tournament. They will be playing tomorrow evening in Fredericksburg, PA, at 4 p.m. against Greencastle-Antrim.

**PIAA State Swim Championships:** West High School Junior Carter Mui finished 9<sup>th</sup> in the 100-meter breaststroke with a time of 56.81 in the PIAA state swimming championships at Bucknell University.

**Elementary Spelling Bee:** Each year, Pocono Mountain School District and Pocono Mountain Education Association work together to coordinate an Elementary Spelling Bee. Classroom-level competitions were held in each homeroom in grades 3 through 6. Winners from the classroom competitions moved on to the grade-level building competitions. The top four spellers from the grade-level building competitions moved on to the district-wide championship held on May 31<sup>st</sup>.

The purpose for the contest was to recognize students who digitally demonstrate a superior understanding of the connection between their life and biomedical research. <u>High Notes Music Festival</u>: The East Junior High bands and choirs were adjudicated at the High Notes Music Festival in Allentown on May 31<sup>st</sup>. The 130 students who participated were all awarded with superior and excellent ratings. They are taught by Mr. Bill Bock, band director, and Ms. Aubrey Parry, Choir Director.

PA Junior Academy of Science State Competition: Eight East Junior High School students competed in the Pennsylvania Junior Academy of Science State Competition May 14<sup>th</sup> to 16<sup>th</sup>. The Pennsylvania Junior Academy of Science (PJAS) is a statewide organization of junior and senior high school students designed to stimulate and promote interest in science among its members through the development of research projects and investigations. All of the students did extremely well, with 5 students earning First Awards and 3 students earning Second Awards. A special congratulations goes out to 8th grader Finn McGovern, who earned a Director's Award for Junior High Excellence in Microbiology.

- Junior High Second Awards were earned by 8<sup>th</sup> grader Sophia Ardioni and 7<sup>th</sup> graders Miriam Thomas and Sheena Patel.

PMSD Lego Robotics Expo: Several students in grades 5 to 8 attended the PMSD Lego Robotics Expo held at West Junior High School in April. Lego Robotics is a program overseen by the gifted teachers in the district, and it allows students to demonstrate what they have learned about the different areas of STEM. This year the theme was "Superpowered," and the students explored energy and the essential role it plays in keeping our world running, from the machines that move us to the food that sustains us to the wireless technologies that connect us. The East Junior High team was made up of six 7<sup>th</sup> graders, and together they were challenged in the areas of robot design, robot games (building mission models and coding the robot to complete different missions) and creating an innovation project that reimagined a better energy future, all while focusing on core values such as teamwork, inclusion, fun, discovery, innovation and impact. This amazing team came up with the idea of a wind bus, which uses several different types of energy, but when able, the bus is fully powered by wind using the wind turbine located on the front of the bus. West High School Update: The West High School ESports team, the Blue Panthers Smash team, advanced to the quarter final rounds in the PlayVs Super Smash Brothers Ultimate tournament in April before falling to RP Scallywags from Ridgefield Park Jr./Sr. High School. The West team of Quinton Abbot, Andrew Church, and Joseph Kulik finished 8th out of 64 teams.

The West High School ESports team also competed in the Pennsylvania Interscholastic Esport Association (PIEA) Super Smash Brothers Ultimate Championship rounds on May 13th at Pittsburgh Technical College. They fought a tough and close competition against Nazareth but fell just short of the championship round in the semifinals. They were able to win the consolation match against Bishop McDevitt to finish third in the PIEA state

ranking. The team consisted of Quinton Abbot, Amir Batiz, Andrew Church, Joseph Kulik, and Kai Nascimento.

All-State Basketball Champ: Congratulations to West High School senior Julian Pagan, who was selected for the All-State Class 5A men's basketball team this year. He is West High School's 6th honoree in the school's history and will continue his basketball and academic careers at Kutztown University in the fall.

<u>Excellence in Education</u>: Mrs. Brenda Fladger, West High School assistant principal, received a 2023 Excellence in Education Award from IU 20 at their annual dinner held on May 11th. Mrs. Fladger received this award for the annual West High School Black History Celebration Assemblies.

<u>National Honor Induction Ceremonies</u>: May 11th, the West High School held its annual National Honor Society induction ceremony, and for the first time ever, its National English Honor Society and Science National Honor Society induction ceremonies. **West Music Accomplishments:** On Friday, May 5<sup>th</sup> the West Junior High and West High School Jazz Ensembles traveled to Delaware Valley High School where they performed in a jazz festival and received a rating based on their performance. Mr. Collins' paper airplane flew 226 feet, 10 inches in 2012. He held the world record for 10 years. Students enjoyed learning about gravity, drafting, aerodynamics and other STEM-related concepts during the assembly that featured various paper airplane designs including the boomerang which flies out and then circles back and returns to its sender when thrown. Students then tried to recreate Mr. Collins' record setting design as he provided step-by-step folding instructions for students to follow. A special

The East Junior High team that competed in Problem 5, The Most Dramatic Problem Ever!!! Division 2, placed 3<sup>rd</sup> out of 65 teams from across the United States and around the world. This team earned the <u>highest score of any team</u> in the competition in the long-term problem and style portions of the competition, and was <u>the highest placing team in this problem for the United States</u>.

The East Junior High School team that competed in Problem 1, Pirates of the Treasure Division 2, placed 5<sup>th</sup> out of 61 teams from across the United States and around the world.

The East High School team that competed in Problem 5, The Most Dramatic Problem Ever!!! Division 3, place 9<sup>th</sup> out of 42 teams from across the United States and around the world.

We are very proud of all of our Odyssey of the Mind teams, and especially our three teams that excelled at regionals, states and at the world finals. Congratulations to the World Final teams and their team advisors, Jennifer Fiore and Galen Smith, for the East Junior High teams, and Kevin Semian, for the East High School team.

Pocono Mountain School District offers Odyssey of the Mind as an afterschool activity open to students in grades 4 to 12. Students try out to be part of these creative problem-solving teams.
